

AAMET FAQ – For Trainers

What has changed in recent months? See ‘AAMET FAQ for Newcomers’ and ‘AAMET FAQ for Existing Practitioners’ for a summary plus links to key documents.

Am I required to join the [AAMET-Trainers](#) e-Group? **Yes! It is vital that all AAMET Trainers join this online forum, which is where most training related announcements are made**

Who is responsible for Practitioner certification, the Trainer or AAMET? The Trainer is 100% responsible. AAMET’s role is to set out the approved basis for this (via Regulations, Codes and Guidelines) but it is the Trainer who issues Practitioner certificates, not AAMET. And in a similar fashion, Trainers of Trainers are responsible for certification of new Trainers, and from this point on, the AAMET Training Panel Leaders (TPL) are responsible for certification of new Trainers of Trainers.

Do I have to follow AAMET Regulations and Guidelines in my training? Yes if you wish your graduates to be eligible to become AAMET Practitioners. You are of course always free to train in whatever way you choose, however if this does not conform to AAMET Regulations, Codes and Guidelines then this will affect the rights of your graduates in respect of AAMET membership.

What is the difference between an Attendance Certificate and an AAMET Practitioner Certificate? The former simply confirms the bearer’s attendance at your workshop, whereas in issuing an AAMET Practitioner Certificate you are confirming that the trainee has not only attended the training but has also clearly demonstrated the required competencies to your satisfaction, as fully described in the [AAMET Guidelines for EFT Trainers](#). The Curriculum and Competencies Work Group is working to develop further guidance on this, aiming to issue an initial proposal for consultation early in 2009.

Are case studies required at Level 3? This is currently up to Trainers’ discretion, although many Trainers choose to require this (and in some cases much more) in order to be sure that the required competencies have been adequately demonstrated.

How do I re-register Level 3 Practitioners whose website listing has lapsed due to non completion of the old CPD requirements? Re-registered Level 3 Practitioners are treated as ‘new’ Level 3 Practitioners. After receiving a signed [acceptance form](#), click [here](#) and follow the instructions for New Practitioner Level 3 (this link will only work for logged-in members of [AAMET-Trainers](#).)

Do I need to get new trainees to sign the [acceptance form](#) during training? This is up to you, but you need to have a record of this before forwarding anyone’s name to AAMET for website listing.

Do I need to use the [acceptance form](#) or can I record Practitioners’ signed compliance in another way (e.g. via verified online click)? This is up to you as it is Trainers who are responsible for certification; however you are encouraged to use the form until replaced by a more effective system.

How can I become a Trainer of Trainers?
